

Dear Prospective Player:

The Slovakia Men's National Lacrosse Team is seeking to identify talented lacrosse players to add to its pool of players to represent and compete for Slovakia at international tournaments, including the European Championships, the World Championships and the Olympics.

In 2022, Slovakia amended its citizenship laws to allow for citizenship by descent for the first time. Slovak citizenship by descent is available to persons whose parents, grandparents, or great-grandparents were born on Slovak territory and held Czechoslovak citizenship (with a generational limit of 3 generations). According to estimates, the Slovak citizenship by descent provision has made up to 800,000 Americans and 1.5 million people globally eligible for Slovak citizenship. Citizenship in Slovakia grants the right to settle and work throughout the European Union (EU), including popular immigration destinations like the Czech Republic, Spain, Italy, Germany and France. A Slovak passport entitles its holder to visa free travel or visa on arrival access to over 180 countries worldwide. Slovakia allows dual citizenship, so you do not have to renounce your current citizenship.

If you are a skilled and experienced lacrosse player and are interested in potentially representing and competing for Slovakia and you think that you may have a descendant (parent, grandparent or greatgrandparent) who was born in Slovak territory or held a Czechoslovak passport, the Slovenská Lakrosová Federácia (SLF) would like to hear from you.

I am currently going through the Slovak citizenship process myself and will try to answer any questions you may have. The SLF looks forward to hearing from you.







The Czech Easter lamb cake is a sweet sponge cake made in a mold shaped like a lamb. It is baked on Holy Saturday (Bílá sobota, or White Saturday in Czech). In the past, people brought the cake to church on Easter Sunday to be blessed by a priest.

# **INGREDIENTS**

3 eggs at room temperature
1 and ¼ cups granulated sugar
1 and ¼ cups buttermilk at room
temperature
2 and ½ cups all-purpose flour
2 Tablespoons lemon zest freshly grated
from a smaller lemon
1 teaspoon vanilla paste or vanilla essence
2 teaspoons baking soda not baking
powder
¼ cup sunflower oil or Canola

# MISC.

- 1 Tablespoon solid fat for greasing the mold
- 1 Tablespoon sifted breadcrumbs for flouring the mold
- 2 Tablespoons powdered sugar to dust the lamb cake

# **INSTRUCTIONS**

Take the eggs out of the fridge at least an hour in advance. Beat them in a large bowl with granulated sugar using an electric mixer. Start at a lower speed, gradually add the sugar (not all at once), and increase the speed. Whipping enough takes at least 5 minutes, more like longer. The result should be a light whipped foam.

Reduce the speed to a minimum, add the vanilla and lemon zest. Gradually whisk in the buttermilk and oil. Combine the flour and baking soda. Add the mixture gradually to the batter, whisking it in



slowly.

Grease the lamb mold thoroughly with oil spray and dust with flour. Butter instead of oil can help the flour adhere well to the mold's inner surface, but it will take more effort. Pour the batter into the prepared pan. It should reach about 1¼ inches below the edge of the pan, as it will puff up during baking.

Place in an oven preheated to 350°F / 177°C for 1-1¼ hours. At the end of baking, test for doneness. Insert a wooden skewer into the lamb. If it comes out dry, the lamb is baked. If the skewer leaves any residue of raw dough, leave the lamb to bake for a further five minutes and then repeat the test.

# SAFELY UNMOLD THE CAKE

Let the baked lamb cake stand for about 10 minutes. Then, carefully flip it over and test whether the lamb has separated from the mold.

If it sticks, place a tea towel soaked and squeezed out in cold water over the mold. Please leave it to sit for a while; then you should be able to remove the lamb from the mold without further problems.

For presentation, tie a bow around the lamb's neck in the colors of spring—green, red, or yellow. If you want the lamb's face to be perfect, put two raisins in place of its eyes. Transfer the cake to a platter and arrange it on the Easter table.
