





## RADKA HERNDON

PRESCHOOL (mainly 5-6-year old children)



## We are starting with Radka Herndon who teaches preschool kids.

### 1. How did you get into teaching?

I got to teach at the Sokol school 'by chance'.
My son was in the Czech class, and his teacher
was moving back to the Czech Republic. Not
having a teacher meant that the class was going
to be canceled. With no previous experience as
a teacher I took over this class until a "real
teacher" was found. No such thing happened; I
stuck with it and have been teaching at this



School until now. I also taught at another Czech school. Later I took on teaching first graders in public schools in Virginia. So I teach to this day and I love this career!

### 2. What do you enjoy most about teaching at the Czech School?

Honestly, I enjoy everything. Small children have amazing souls and a desire to learn. As a teacher, I can witness a significant turning point when you see them rise. I believe I can do a lot of good deeds for these children and highlight their innocent and pure souls. It is a very warm feeling when you see children enjoying learning. In older children, the magic of education turns into rituals and hard work, and they stop liking school, and that is a shame.

## 3. What were you like as a student when you were the age of the children you teach today?

I was stubborn and shy. I liked playing with boys rather than girls. I lacked self-confidence and thought I did not look pretty enough, so I became very individualistic.

## 4. Can you tell us some facts that only a few know about you?

Outside of teaching, I have a few exciting hobbies. I find solace in working in my garden, sowing, and watching seeds grow. I also have a passion for creating and organizing. And when it comes to the environment, I'm quite the advocate - I avoid buying anything in plastic bags.

On a personal note, I wrote a story about my life and it will be published in a book in the fall of 2024. I'm excited to share this part of me with you all.






## **CREATURE: TREE • WATER • STONE**

## CHLEBÍČKY Open-Faced Sanwiches

A crowd-pleaser, open-faced sandwich - Czech style! This is an easy recipe.



## **Ingredients**

- French bread (French baguette)
- Potato salad or spreadable butter
- Hard-boiled eggs cut into circles
- Dill pickles gherkins
- Ham and hard salami thin slices
- Hard cheese Fdam
- Tomato
- Springs of parsley
- Chili flakes

### Instructions

Place the eggs in cold water, bring to a

boil, and cook for 8 minutes. Cool them in cold water, peel the hard-boiled eggs, and slice them into circles.

Slice the French bread into slices about half an inch thick.

Spread potato salad or butter over the slices.

Top each sandwich with rolled-up ham or hard salami, cheese, and slices of hard-boiled egg.

Continue garnishing the chlebíček with sliced pickles and tomato wedges. For a nice presentation, add a sprig of parsley.

You may sprinkle chili flakes over the hard-boiled egg for color.

You can use various kinds of cheese, salami, ham, or vegetables. Sprinkle the egg slices with sweet ground paprika or chili flakes for a nice effect.

The story of Czech *chlebíčky* goes back to 1919 when Jan Paukert and his wife opened a deli close to the National Theatre. Their deli became

a symbol of quality. These small, two—or three-bite open-faced sandwiches with assortments of toppings are traditionally served at parties and events. He created them to offer something between finger food and a traditional sandwich. These gourmet open-faced sandwiches really caught on!
